Your Privacy Matters To GRTI

GRTI wants to keep your account information private and prevent unauthorized account changes.

Recently you may have noticed GRTI representatives have asked you to verify account information when calling about your account. This is to keep your information private and ensure that changes aren't made without your permission.

Account verification applies when any information needs to be given out, even an account balance. If

you have a caregiver who usually handles your account with GRTI, you will need to add their name on the account. GRTI advises that you be certain any individual you add to your account, other than

Verification Methods:

1. SS # or Tribal ID #
2. Account Password
3. Security Question

a spouse, be responsible and trustworthy.

There are three ways GRTI may ask you to verify the account: by providing your social security number or tribal ID, answering a security question, or provide a password for the account.

We appreciate your patience and time when you verify your account information. The few seconds it takes can make a difference in keeping your private information just that, private. Are you getting a new home?

Let us help you make sure your phone is ready to ring by the time you move in.

If you are getting a new home from your district, congratulations! While this is an exciting time for you and your family the thought of moving can be overwhelming. There is furniture, toys, clothes, dishes and so much more to move. Some things are pretty simple to move from one location to another but taking your phone service may not be as simple or quick.

GRTI would like to help you make this a smooth move as possible when it comes to your phone service. If you wait to notify us of your move on the day you move in, there will be a waiting period

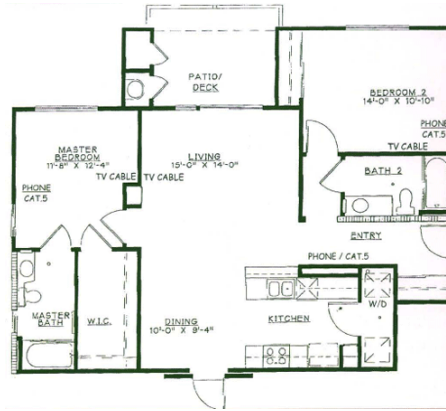
of a couple weeks or more. This is because GRTI will need to do construction and this requires a Service Line Agreement (SLA) to be signed. The SLA is required by GRTI and Gila River so that construction can be done to bring a phone line to your new home.

Around the time the foundation is laid and the walls are being built, notify GRTI about your new home.

This will provide enough time for the papers required by GRTI to be completed and routed to the appropriate offices for the approval of construction.

Anyone who is getting a new home built will

be required to sign a SLA for GRTI. You can have one faxed, mailed or e-mailed or print one out from www.gilanet.net in the residential section. Remember to get your SLA signed early and keep GRTI informed of the construction of your new home!

Great Family Treat

The summer is a great time to have a dessert that is light , cool and topped with fruit.

We have all made strawberry shortcake but what about making your own angel food cake. Here is a recipe you can use for that next batch of strawberries you purchase. Fruits used in desserts not only add color but can make it healthy and fun for any family get-together. Have fun making angel food cake!

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup and 2 Tbsp. cake flour
- 3/4 cup and 2 Tbsp. white sugar
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- 3/4 cup egg whites
- 1/2 tsp. cream of tartar
- 1/4 tsp. vanilla extract
- 1/4 tsp. almond extract

Directions

Beat egg whites until they form stiff peaks, and then add cream of tartar, vanilla extract, and almond extract.

Sift together flour, sugar, and salt. Repeat five times.

Gently combine the egg whites

with the dry ingredients, and then pour into an ungreased 10-inch tube pan.

Place cake pan in a cold oven. Turn oven on; set it to 325 degrees. Cook for about one hour, or until cake is golden brown.

Invert cake, and allow it to cool in the pan. When thoroughly cooled, remove from pan. Serves eight.

Jury Duty Phone Scam

Beware, if you receive a call saying that you failed to report to jury duty - pay attention!

How The Scam Works

You get a call from someone stating they are from your local court house. In this case the city of Phoenix or Gila River. They state that you did not show for jury duty. Since you did not appear, a warrant will be issued for your arrest.

At this point they may ask you to verify your personal information. This would include your birth date, social security number and address. You could even be asked to verify credit card numbers.

Most of us would willingly give out the information since no one wants a warrant of arrest issued on them.

Scams work because they play on your emotions. Whether you won a million dollars wich seems so exciting or are threatened to have



a warrant for your arrest which can be a frightening thought, you must always avoid giving out personal information. If you are not sure, call the court house by using the

listed number in the phonebook. At that time, you can call to ask if you were called for jury duty or not. Whatever you do, do not ask the person on the phone for the number to call, it could be a fake one they answer themselves.

Follow these simple rules to keep from getting scammed:

- In regards to Jury Duty, you will rarely get a phone call at home or work. You will receive a letter
- Never, never give out your personal information or credit card information over the phone.

Helpful Tips If You Live Alone part 2

Information for the elderly or disabled when living alone. If you have a family member that may live alone please share these tips with them and help implement them.

Space Heaters: Many individuals think that using an electric space heater or oven to heat their home will help them save money. It usually doesn't, but use a heater with safety. Do not set it up by a bed, curtains or furniture.

Unwelcome visitors: don't open the door if you don't know the person. If you are concerned call the Police to do a check on your home.

Cars: always lock your car. Don't leave any valuables in open site on the back seat or floor.

House Keys: do not store an extra house key in front of the home or under a rock. That is too common. If you can leave a key with a dependable relative or neighbor, that can help you if you loose your keys.

Alert One: always wear the pendant in case you fall. The pendant is water-proof and can be worn in the shower or tub. Make sure your Alert One unit is plugged in at all times. If you are not sure, call GRTI to have it checked.

Taking all precautions to ensure that you are safe is worth the care and practice.

Voicemail Retrieval

Subscribe to GRTI's voice mail and check it anytime you want! You don't have to be home to check your messages. As long as you have access to a phone you can check your voice mail anytime!

To use

1. Dial 796-0000 from a phone. You will get a prompt to enter your mailbox number, enter your 7-digit phone number.
2. At the prompt, enter your pin.

If this is your first time accessing your voice mail your pin will be 0000. You will then have the chance to create a new pin.

To add Voice Mail to your account call GRTI! Features are typically added on the same day of your request. You can get started using your voice mail while enjoying the convenience of checking it from home, the office...anywhere you are!
